Retailers of food, butchers, bakers, green grocers, food processors and manufacturers, food distributors and transport and wholesaler companies. Any business providing services that link farm to plate, who would like to focus part or all of their business on the trade, distribution and promotion of regional food is welcome to attend.

### What will I gain from the forum?

The day will focus on the business opportunities evolving from the development of a regional food system and the establishment of a regional food council to promote regional trade and market our local food to locals and visitors alike. The forum will provide an opportunity to share insights and identify new opportunities to create a regional value chain focusing of food production and consumption. Discussion will also focus on how to overcome some of the challenges of using and distributing local produce on a consistent basis.

### Why is this being offered?

This forum is part of a larger project. The past year has seen a focused effort to develop the Farm to Plate movement in the Mackay Isaac Whitsunday Region. Significant planning and development activity has been underway to stimulate the region's food culture and develop food tourism. Much of the work thus far has centred on getting producers ready to engage with tourism and hospitality industry. Work is now underway to engage our region's chefs and the general public.
